PRODUCTION NOTES

Series of Four Skits

Setting:

Lifeway Lyft is an Uber service that gives people "a lift from where you are going to where you need to be." In each skit, a character calls Lifeway Lyft for a ride, and a conversation takes place within the car, leading to new direction and finding God's will.

Format: A series of four skits with the theme of finding God's will, Which can accompany the Bible study "Discovering God's Will."

Characters:

- **Driver:** This can be the same person or a different person in each skit. The driver's conversation leads the passenger to consider God's will in her life.
- **Wendy Worldly (skit one only):** business/career woman, upper class, wants fame and fortune
- **Melinda Millennial (skit two only):** (looking for a job that allows freedom, flexible schedule, very attached to social media
- **Holly Hippie (skit three only):** free spirit, seeking enlightenment through New Age avenues
- **Connie Conforming (skit four only):** very social and very concerned about conforming to seeking the approval of her friends; desires to be an influencer

Props:

Driver needs a compass;

Each character will need a phone

The setting for each skit is inside a car, so the car interior can be created with chairs (front seat and back) and something used as a steering wheel for the driver.

Theme:

Each character gets into the Lyft with a specific destination in mind, but the driver gently changes her mind to consider God's will for her life.

Skit 1: "Wendy Worldly"

SCRIPT

Wendy: *(fumbling in briefcase)* I know I have that business card in here somewhere. Ah--here it is! Lifeway Lyft "we give you a lift from where you are to where you NEED to be." Eeh--cliche, but I need to get to this meeting. An opportunity like this doesn't come along every day. I need to make a great first impression. Let's see--1-800-UPLIFT *(punches on phone)* Hello? Is this Lifeway Lyft? I have an emergency. My car is in the shop today, and I have a fundraiser to attend this evening *(looks at her phone)* and I need to get going soon. Do you have my location? Are you available right now? Oh, good. I'll be waiting for you at the curb.

(hurries to curb and driver pulls up)

Wendy: So glad you were available!

Driver: Yeah, no problem. Where exactly are you headed?

Wendy: *(hands him paper)* Here's the address.

Driver: *(looks at address)* Sounds important--wow, this is in the financial district. Pretty swanky!

Wendy: That's an understatement. This fundraiser could be the most important event of my life. It could change the direction of my life if I am able to connect with the executive I'm hoping to see. I'm counting on having an opportunity to get my foot in the door and share my ideas with him. My career goals depend on this meeting happening and going well. I won't mention any names but this guy could be the key to launching me into corporate fame and fortune. Can you go any faster? Are you sure this is the quickest way to get me where I want to go? Should you have taken the last exit?

Driver: Just relax. What exactly is it that you're hoping to pitch to this guy if you get to talk to him? What do you do exactly?

Wendy: Without saying too much, this is proprietary information, you know--I have access to a phenomenal new-to-the-market water filtration system that will change the way the 1%-ers think of bottled water. Perrier, Smerier; Fiji water? Smart Water? Pellegrino? Voss Water? When my product becomes available, those waters will be nothing more than a drink from the garden hose. People will be willing to pay

top dollar for the pristine water from this system. While production costs are low (just pennies), I can charge an obscene amount per liter .

Driver: Sounds like you stand to make a pretty penny from this water. Are you sure this is the direction God wants you to go?

Wendy: Well, It says "He shall give you the desires of your heart" and that is pretty clear direction. It is the desire of my heart to succeed and be prosperous...

Driver: Mmmmmm...

Wendy: Are you absolutely sure this is the quickest way to get me where I want to go?
(looking out the window)

Driver: So what will you do with the profits that you make?

Wendy: By catering to the upper 1%, I will soon join them in the stratosphere. No more middle class for me. I've always thought I was meant to have a personal assistant named Dylan and a chauffeur named Clive. I would like a penthouse apartment Now, I know this won't happen overnight. But that's my dream. Those are my desires. This meeting could be my steppingstone to moving past mediocrity (the domain of the ordinary people) to where I truly belong.

Driver: Those are lofty aspirations. But have you considered that it is not only rich people who need water? Have you thought about the implications this water filtration system could have globally?

Wendy: Absolutely. I hope this takes off in Europe. They are very picky about their water in France and Monaco. And they have the money to burn on fancy waters, too....

Driver: Have you considered the need for pure water elsewhere? Like maybe third world countries? Maybe a place like Sudan?

Wendy: Third world countries? What are you talking about? The only "sedan" I'm interested in is the black 4-door Mercedes Benz I'm going park in my garage someday. Where are we?

Driver: *(gets out large compass)*

Wendy: What's that? Don't you have GPS?

Driver: This, young lady, is a true navigational treasure, way more accurate than GPS.

Wendy: Ok, as long as get to where I want to be....

Driver: This will definitely direct you to where you NEED to be. But anyway, back to your water processing idea, it could actually be life changing for people around the world.

Wendy: I'm counting on it changing my life...(cha-ching, baby!)

Driver: Maybe you're thinking is too narrow; think bigger, and wider. God's plans often benefit more than just oneself. Changing and saving millions of lives worldwide by making pure water available to the masses could be amazing! (*hands off wheel*) Envision this--your water filtration process in the most remote of villages, providing clean water and sustaining life. Wow! I can see it!

Wendy: I never thought of that...

Driver: Your vision to reach the 1%-ers is ridiculously small when you consider that you could be reaching the 99%-ers. Think of it.

Wendy: But the 99%-ers have no money. They can't pay what I'm asking.

Driver: That's true. But how much is one life worth? How much more satisfying would it be to reach the whole world, instead of that small group of socialites who would only take two sips from your water before heading over to the hors d'oeuvres table. That bottle of water would mean nothing to her. But you could be helping to provide water that means everything, saving mummies and babies and families from dehydration and death.

Wendy: I never really considered it that way. So do you really think that my idea could be turned into a globally sustainable water resource?

Driver: From what you've told me, I do.

Wendy: Are we still going the right way? Should we have taken an exit back there?

Driver: Let me check my compass. Actually, to get you where you NEED to go, we're right on track.

Wendy: Wait just a second--where I need to go....or where I want to go? What are you saying?

Driver: What would it take for you to change your focus and your direction? Is this fundraiser where you are headed a sure thing? Do you have an appointment? How do you know you will meet with him?

Wendy: No, unfortunately it's not a sure thing. It's a hopeful thing. I just have to make it happen--if I can just find the guy in the crowd, which I think I can. And I know if I can connect with him he'll want to hear more.

Driver: Oh, so it's a long shot. So basically, what you are telling me is that as confident as you sounded, this is not a sure thing at all. Wouldn't you prefer to head in the direction you NEED to go?

Wendy: And you know where that is? Where God can give me the desires of my heart?

Driver: As a matter of fact, I do. But maybe you need to change the direction you are focused on--the desires of MY heart, and remember that we are not to labor to be rich. Riches do not bring satisfaction. We are to lay up treasures for ourselves in heaven, because where our treasure is, that is where our heart is.

Wendy: (*subdued*) That is definitely a different perspective.

Driver: Look at the compass. It is pointing due north, and God's best is always always true north. I can tell that you're willing to consider a different direction. If you're willing to step out in faith and believe the compass, we can follow this compass due north to God's Will. And you know what is waiting for us there?

Wendy: A shiny black Mercedes Benz?

Driver: Better! A life filled with with contentment, peace and joy, that no amount of money could every buy. If we follow this compass, we will end up at another fundraiser--the Water for the World Foundation fundraiser. That's where your life and your goals could be transformed and used for mankind--ways you could never have imagined. You could have a global and eternal impact to the world.

Wendy: (*deep breath*) Oh this is crazy! But I think you may be right. Ok, if I do what you're saying and it fails, what then?

Driver: It may not like look like your original vision, but in all my years of taking people where they NEED to be, this compass has never once failed. Trust me, and trust the compass. You may not get that Mercedes, but you always have my card. We at Lifeway Lyft Services will be there for you.

Wendy: And you'll have the compass with you?

Driver: Always! Ok, here we are. Your destination--and your destiny. You need to be here, and I'm betting they need you, too.

Skit 2: "Melinda Millennial"

SCRIPT

Melinda: (*fumbling in backpack*) I know I have that business card in here somewhere. Ah--here it is! Lifeway Lyft "we give you a lift from where you are to where you NEED to be." (*loud eye roll*) Seriously. That is so lame. Well, whatever--I need a ride. Let's see--1-800-UPLIFT (*punches on phone*) Hello? Is this Lifeway Lyft? I am a millennial so I don't own a car and limit my carbon footprint as much as possible by sharing rides. But, all of my friends are unbelievably unavailable today. Can you pick me up fairly soon? I'll be waiting for you at the curb.

(*strolls to curb and driver pulls up*)

Melinda: So glad you were available!

Driver: Yeah, no problem. Where exactly are you headed?

Melinda: (*hands him paper*) Here's the address. I'm headed to a job fair..

Driver: (*looks at address*) Oh. I've heard of this one. It's a big one! What do you do? What kind of job are you hoping to find?

Melinda: Well, I'm not boxed into any one career opportunity. I'm fluid and adaptable, and free to consider many options.

Driver: So what skill set do you bring to the table? You look like you could be one of those "STEM girls"?

Melinda: STEM girl? Why do people keep asking me that? I'm not opposed to working at a nursery or flower shop, but I don't know...

Driver: No, no, no. STEM stands for Science, Technology, Engineering and Math. Those seem to be the hot commodities these days. What did you study in school?

Melinda: Well, I took a gap year and traveled through Europe to find myself, and then took a few junior college courses in interpersonal communication and rhetoric. To be honest, I never really found my niche. The school environment is not where I learn best. I need less conformity and more freedom to explore my psyche.

Driver: Ahh, you're searching for something. Have you sought God's will in this?

Melinda: Of course. I'm living under grace, not the law. I'm free to march to the beat of my own drummer, wherever that may take me. Are we headed to where I want to go? *(looking out the window)* Oh, hang on--I just got a "like" on my instagram post.

Driver: Oh, don't worry. This compass will direct us to where you NEED to go. But back to your comment--who exactly is your drummer, may I ask? Is it God?

Melinda: It must be. He's the one who made me so unique and wonderful. He knows my need to be free. I'm a free spirit--free to find my own way in this world. Free to have a job that caters to my availability, provides flexible hours and gives me freedom to wear what I am comfortable wearing. I need a job that meets my salary and benefits expectations (I need upper 40's, minimum), offers a clean eating green cafeteria, a standing desk and a yoga ball in every workspace. And I will definitely need time to keep up with my social media accounts. Fairly reasonable expectations, I think.

Driver: *(gets compass out)* This job fair is not registering on my compass. The job you're describing can't be found. I think you've believed an urban legend. The employer that pays a lot for little work and the flexibility you demand doesn't exist. I hate to break it to you, but at this job fair, the employers want employees who work responsibly, come to work on time and are willing to start at the bottom. *(looking at the compass)*

Melinda: What is that you're looking at? How is that clock supposed to tell you how to get me where I want to go?

Driver: This is not a clock--this is a compass. This device is a guidance system that has successfully taken people where they need to go for years. Would you consider a different kind of job fair?

Melinda: I'm open. What's your thought? I think I know where I NEED to be...

Driver: I happen to know that the city's Urban Planning Committee is holding a job fair of sorts today, with jobs available to fill positions in their resources unit which serve the homeless community.

Melinda: Hmm--that intrigues me. *(fiddles on phone, creating a post)* What kind of position would fit my requirements?

Driver: Well, your job expectations may need a little tweaking. I can tell you're not a nine-to-fiver, and it's obvious you have a sense of community and world awareness. You want a job that doesn't confine you, right? This could be an opportunity for you to make a difference in the world by helping the less fortunate of the world to find freedoms of their own. You're media savvy, and your flexibility may be exactly

what the doctor ordered. Is this something you would consider? My compass is heading true north, and in all my years, this compass has never failed to get people where they NEED to be.

Melinda: Hmm...okay. I'm willing to give it a look. Just now, since you mentioned the Urban Planning Committee, I sent out an informal survey to my Instagram followers, and I have already had many positive responses. Apparently all my friends know about it!

Driver: Wow, you did all that in the last few minutes? You work fast. But regardless of what InstaBook may tell you, God's answer is always true north. This time your followers happened to confirm the compass direction, but that isn't always the case. Sometimes you need to rely on what you know to be true--like me and this compass. I'm glad you're willing to consider a different direction. If you're willing to step out in faith and believe the compass, we can follow this compass true north to God's Will for you. Maybe you'll find the Urban Planning Committee will provide options for the liberty and freedom you are seeking. And you know what is waiting for us there?

Melinda: I wish it would be a part-time position that pays full-time wages....but I have a feeling that is not...

Driver: You're right. But you'll be fulfilled, and that's what will bring you the true freedom you are looking for. You'll be free, but as a servant of God.

Melinda: So you say this compass of yours never fails?

Driver: Not once. Trust me, and trust the compass. You'll be contributing to the world; you'll be God's instrument, and your efforts will have an eternal impact. Look at the compass now--it's pointing true north, and God's best is always true north.

Driver: Ok, here we are. Your destination--and your destiny. Serving God and fulfilling God's will while still being free. You need to be here, and I'm betting they need you, too.

Melinda: Ok, I'll give it a try. I like the idea of this being a more organic work environment bringing awareness and compassion to the plight of the homeless. This may work for me. I'm glad you had that compass. Doesn't sound like a car is in my near future though, so I'm sure I'll be seeing you again (as she exits the car).

Driver: Don't worry, I'm always here!

Melinda: Thank you. I'll be sure to give you 5 stars on Yelp.

Skit 3: "Holly Hippie"

SCRIPT

Holly: (*fumbling in her large woven purse*) I know I have that business card in here somewhere. Ah--here it is! Lifeway Lyft "we give you a lift from where you are to where you NEED to be." Groovy! Hopefully Lifeway Lyft can get me to my seminar. Let's see--1-800-UPLIFT (*punches on phone*) Hello? Is this Lifeway Lyft? I'm registered to attend a seminar, and I need to get going soon. Do you have my location? Are you available right now? Oh, good. I'll be waiting for you at the curb.

(hurries to curb and driver pulls up)

Holly: Hi. My name's Holly! So glad you were available!

Driver: Yeah, no problem. Where exactly are you headed?

Holly: I'm headed for a weekend of spiritual growth and enlightenment.

Driver: Actually, I meant what is the address you are heading to?

Holly: (*hands him brochure*) I'm not exactly sure but I know it's a retreat area outside of town, away from all the city lights and distractions. It's called the Center for Spiritual Enlightenment. This could be a life-changing weekend for me.

Driver: Wow--sounds deep. Life-changing--eh? What is it about your life that needs changing?

Holly: Everything. My life right now has no purpose or focus. I believe that the god of the universe has more for me. I want peace and contentment. I want more understanding of my place in this world. I want to understand the spiritual energy and positive forces that drive humanity. We're all such insignificant parts of this great universe, but we need to learn how to channel our creativity and vitality into experiencing our true potential.

Driver: Wow! That's been the goal since the beginning of time--man naturally wants to find the place where they fit in and find true inner peace. And you think this Center for Spiritual Enlightenment has the answer for that?

Holly: I'll never know until I try. I hadn't heard about this place until last week. I just happened to find a brochure on the ground, and I don't believe in coincidences, so I

was sure that God was sending me a message. Are you absolutely sure this is the way to get me where I want to go? (*looking out the window*)

Driver: No worries, we're heading to where you NEED to go. So you believe that God is directing you to this center, and you are seeking God in this?

Holly: Oh, definitely. I'm quite new to the Bible, but doesn't it encourage us to seek God and His essence of peace and love? Seek and you will find...And all that far out jazz?

Driver: Well, yes and no. I'm happy to know that you are seeking God, but I'm a little concerned about your methods. I'm not sure that the Center for Spiritual Enlightenment is based on the Biblical principals of godly peace and love. What I do know about it is that it is open to all avenues of spiritual pursuits, and it could lead you down a wrong path, Holly.

Holly: Really? The last thing I want is to be misguided--again. I had a friend who tried to convince me that the stars held my future, and that sure didn't pan out. Then I met another person was sure that my destiny lay in tarot card readings and dream interpretations--and that was just creepy. It's not cool, dude!

Driver: Well, God is already giving you discernment. You're right, those are not areas where you should be dabbling while searching for God. You won't find Him there.

Holly: You sound like you know what you are talking about. But are we still heading out of town? I'm getting a little turned around.

Driver: (*gets out large compass*)

Holly: What's that?

Driver: This, Holly, is a true navigational treasure, way more accurate than GPS. It is a compass.

Holly: How does it direct a person? Does it use crystals? Feng Shui? Is it old Chinese navigation? Does it use astrology?

Driver: Definitely none of those. This compass is powered by God, and God alone. This will definitely direct you to where you NEED to be. And it doesn't seem to be routing us to the Center of Spiritual Enlightenment, but rather, it seems to be re-routing us.

Holly: Wait! What? Where are you taking me?

Driver: According to the compass, which by the way, has never failed, we are heading north to The Way, the Truth and the Life Retreat Center.

Holly: I'm not registered there for any of their events. This could be a waste of time.

Driver: It's never a waste of time. This retreat center is always willing to take drop-ins and those who end up there in their genuine search for truth.

Driver: That actually sounds miserable. Let me tell about "heavenly mattresses" which envelop you in peace and comfort while you rest in Him and His love.

Holly: Wow! That sounds divine.

Driver: Speaking of divine, I believe that's exactly what awaits you at The Way, the Truth and the Life Retreat Center. A divine appointment. You'll get that solid foundation that you've been seeking in all the wrong places. Oh, it looks like we're here.

Holly: This is unbelievably nice. I'm getting good vibes already, but I am a little nervous!

Driver: Great! But just remember, if the compass directed you here, this is truly where you NEED to be. No need to be nervous or afraid.

Holly: So are you available to pick me up when my retreat is over? And will you have the compass with you?

Driver: I don't leave home without it! Enjoy your weekend. Keep seeking God, and you will find Him--truly.

Skit 4: "Connie Conforming"

SCRIPT

Connie: (*scrolling on phone*) I screenshot that business card, where is it? Found it! Lifeway Lyft "we give you a lift from where you are to where you Need to be." Whatever...they need a new slogan (*eye-rolling*) Let's see--1-800-UPLIFT (*punches on phone*) Hello? Is this Lifeway Lyft? I need to get to the village in uptown to meet a group of friends. Do you have my location? Are you available right now? Oh, good. I'll be waiting for you at the curb.

(*hurries to curb and driver pulls up*)

Connie: So glad you were available!

Driver: Yeah, no problem. Where exactly are you headed?

Connie: (*hands him paper*) I'm headed to Thanks-a-Latte Coffee House on 5th Avenue. Before I left work today, I checked all of my social media accounts like I always do to find out what's happening tonight, and the best I can determine, the Coffee House is one of the hot spots tonight.

Driver: Oh, okay. So Thanks-A-Latte Coffee House on 5th Avenue. Got it.

Connie: (*eyes on phone*) Wow. There's a lot of people out and about tonight. Tony Trendy, one of the premier influencers in Dallas is trending about an event going on near Reunion Tower. That looks like it could be a good place to see and be seen. You never know what local celebrities will pop in to one of these local events. I heard Kylie is in town this week--I wonder if she will be there?

Driver: Oh, okay. Reunion Tower. Got it.

Connie: Wait a minute--wait just a minute. The Creme-de-la-Creme Gallery is holding its annual Happy Hour Auction this evening. The artsy crowd is always good to rub elbow with and... Ooh! there are always salivating paparazzi wandering this event. I would have a really good chance of being caught with a celebrity and finding myself posted on the event's webpage.

Driver: Creme-de-la-Creme Gallery. Where is that?

Connie: I just sent you the link. Let's go there first.

Driver: Wait! You said "first"? Are you planning to hit all these events tonight?

Connie: Of course--as many as I can. I just stay long enough at each one to be seen, get a few selfies and post about it on all my social media accounts. You know....

Driver: Forgive me for my ignorance but what is the purpose of all of this evening's gallivanting? What is your goal? What do you get out of it?

Connie: Gallivanting? This is serious networking. This is the age in which we live. Anyone who is anybody will be at at least one of these events. I need people to know that I am as current and relevant as all the influencers in our area. People will know that I'm important.

Driver: So you need to be seen at these events so people will know who you are??

Connie: Exactly. I plan to be an influencer myself one day. And to do that, I need follow the in crowd, be seen with them and learn from that. That how everyone will get to know who I am..

Driver: Oh. So who are you?

Connie: I want them to know about ME. That my Spotify list is the same as Kim Kardashian's. That my newest TicToc dance video is going viral. My hashtag #werethesame is blowing up. And even my 30,000 followers on the Gram love what I had for breakfast this morning.

Driver: The Gram? Are you talking about Instagram? Your breakfast food?

Connie: Yes, of course Instagram. Are we going the right way? I'm not exactly sure myself where this gallery is. And artistic vegan breakfast plates are getting a lot of "likes" on FoodieFeed.com---Have you seen their twitter feed? If I could just get my lemon grass steel oats pancakes with agave pecan syrup noticed on FoodiesFeed.com--maybe TMZ would even notice! That's the ultimate!

Driver: That's what you are ultimately trying to achieve? Popularity on TMZ? You've told me where the beautiful people are going to be seen tonight...and you want to be there. Do you feel like God is leading you to be like all of these worldly people you want to be seen with?

Connie: Well sure. These are today's "influencers" - they impact our culture! Doesn't the Bible talk about people who turned their world upside down? That's exactly why I'm following these influencers.

Driver: Oh, I see. You're following people who have no eternal mindset or motivation, and think you will be turning the world upside-down for God?

Connie: Well yeah...but no! I don't know--when you say it like that. I don't know. I just don't want to be different--but I also want to have an impact on the world. I'm so confused. And shouldn't we be there by now?

Driver: Let me see your breakfast post again. (*looks at picture/looks at compass*) Would you consider a different destination this evening? This compass directs us to where you NEED to be, and I don't believe it's taking us to the gallery, or to a coffee shop or downtown to Reunion tower

Connie: Did you say compass? (*googling it*) "archaic device which directs a person safely home." That's your GPS thing? I thought it was yard art and maybe you also did Amazon deliveries.

Driver: No, this is a compass that I bring everywhere with me. It directs people to where they NEED to go. And it's never been wrong. When you follow God's will true north, that is where you NEED to be. And it just so happens to be directing us to another area where I know there is a farmer's market.

Connie: Farmer's Market? Seriously? Will anyone of significance be there?

Driver: This Farmer's Market is different. It's trending all over the internet as they promote buying imperfect foods and veggies.

Connie: Imperfect? I'm seeking perfection in my life as I follow these popular, trendy people.

Driver: You do realize they are not perfect, don't you? God made you perfect in His eyes, just like imperfect produce still is perfectly nutritious. This farmer's market sells unique, one-of-a kind produce items that can be used to build a better food system for everyone. What if you started your own trend? You have the contacts and social savvy to make this place go viral, and become a place where people want to see and be seen. Why don't you be an influencer instead of relying on others?

Connie: I never thought I could be that person. At least ,not this soon. Maybe someday. But not today. So your compass that is never wrong is leading you to take me there? What is it called again?

Driver: It's called the Bread of Life Farmer's Market and Coop. (*Connie is googling on phone*) and my compass is most definitely pointing you in that direction. For you, it is true north.

Connie: Ok, I found it, but I'm taking a chance being seen there without anybody I'd want to be seen with. This could be really embarrassing.

Driver: But the compass never operates on chance. I can tell that you're willing to consider a different direction. If you're willing to step out in faith and believe the compass, we can follow this compass true north to God's Will. And you know what is waiting for you there?

Connie: Could it be the Food Network photographers and groupies?
