Series of 4 Skits

Setting:

The game show is set in New Testament times.

Format:

Four very short skits

Characters:

- Johnny Olson (announcer)
- Tammy Tabernacle (hostess),
- Dorcas Dimwit (country, wife of sheep farmer)
- Naomi Know-it-All (confident, academic, snotty)
- (Optional) Vanna White - no lines, but reveals/points to the questions and answers

Plot Summary

Dorcas Dimwit and Naomi Know-It-All are contestants on the game show **Jerusalem Jeopardy**. (Note: It is not really played like true Jeopardy.) We have the Announcer (Johnny Olsen) and our hostess (Tabernacle Tammy). Each skit addresses two questions, and answers are given in a multiple choice format. These questions correlate with the homework of the Bible study **Q&A**. Each of the four weeks the contestants are competing for a prize package. On the final week, there is a “final Jeopardy” question to which the contestants write their answer.

Costumes:

Contestants will wear tunics/robes/togas. Hostess will have a distinctive tunic with bells, and ornamentation

Props:

- Two bells/buzzers
- Easel to display each week’s questions and answers
- Q&A cards for hostess



JERUSALEM JEOPARDY SKIT ONE SCRIPT

**Questions: Who do you say that I am?
What profits a man to gain the whole world...?**

Announcer: *(off-camera)* Welcome ladies and gentlemen to this week’s episode of **Jerusalem Jeopardy**, the game show where the questions are essential for eternity, crucial for the cross, significant to the soul, but the points don’t matter. I’m your announcer, Johnny Olsen. This week’s episode is “Jesus- Man or Myth.” You’ve been reading about Him in the Galilee Gazette, hearing reports on TV Mount Zion, otherwise known as TMZ and even the tabloid tablets that you read in the marketplace have outlandish stories by alleged “witnesses.” Are the reports true? Are the reporters jokers or journalists? Are we hearing fake news? We’ll find out, as we delve deep into the dark bowels of the truth. Inquiring minds want to know.

And here’s the host of **Jerusalem Jeopardy**, the one, the only, the hostess with the most-est, your sweetheart and mine, Tammy Tabernacle

(Audience goes wild)

Tammy: So..uh....you farm sheep??

Dorcas: Yes, we grow sheep on our farm.

Tammy: So, you’re married to a shepherd?

Dorcas: Isn’t that what I said?

Tammy: Ok, welcome to the game. Now let’s meet our other contestant, Naomi Know-It-All.

Naomi: Hi, Tammy! I’m an assistant editor and research supervisor to the head scribe of the Temple Auxiliary.

Tammy: Wow! And exactly what does an assistant editor and research supervisor to the head scribe of the Temple Auxiliary do?

Naomi: I thoroughly research, authenticate and validate the ancient scrolls to facilitate the scribe’s official documentation of genealogical research.

Tammy: That’s a mouthful! That sounds very intense, Naomi.

Naomi: Intense is a good word. Certainly more “intense” than *sheep farming*...

Dorcias: (*Dorcias responds, insulted*) What? That’s just hateful, ya’ll.

Tammy: Ladies, let’s not quibble--let’s save that competitive energy for the today’s game, and we’ve got a good one. You know the rules of the game. And Johnny Olsen, tell our contestants what they are playing for this round.

Announcer: Tammy, today’s prize package includes an all-expense paid trip for two to the Sea of Galilee, including a deep-sea fishing excursion with a guaranteed net-breaking, boat-sinking load of fish and concluding with a romantic coastal fish fry

(*contestants “ooh!” “aah”*)

Tammy: Thanks Johnny. Sounds like an adventure for sure. Let’s get started with our first question. Hands on your buzzers, ladies. A man named Jesus has been very prominent in the news lately. Rumors have been flying about His true identity. Eyewitness reports say that He’s been seen putting mud on a blind man’s eyes, purposely disrupting the vendors at the temple market place, healing on the Sabbath, offending the Pharisees at every turn, to name just a few examples. Based on these reports, what is this man’s true identity?

ALPHA: An escaped lunatic from Ye Olde Asylum who believes himself a prophet

BETA: The reincarnation of John the Baptist who himself was a very strange character.

GAMMA: The Messiah, the Son of God

Dorcias: (*dings first*) This is a trick question. My answer is DELTA--None of the above. I know who you’re talking about, I know his family in Nazareth. They’re normal people, not a lunatic among them. They’re hard-working, down-to-earth, dare i say boring folk. Based on what I know about his family, I don’t think he’s any of those things--in fact, I believe my

second cousin bought a dining room set from him. Those reports have to be exaggerated .Who believes the tabloids, anyway?

Tammy: I’m sorry, Dorcas. DELTA is not the correct answer because it wasn’t one of your options. Naomi, do you have a guess?

Naomi: (*dings*) I don’t have a “guess”--I have an answer. The correct answer is GAMMA: The Messiah, the Son of God.

Dorcas: Phhht! He’s the son of Joseph. (*aside*) and she thinks she’s so educated...

Naomi: He’s also the Son of God. Trust me, the old scrolls back me up on this.

Tammy: Naomi, you are correct, for 200 denarii. Let’s move on to question number 2. Here’s the questions: What profit is it to a man if he gains the whole world...

Dorcas: (*dings*) He must have won the Powerball! What luck! What good fortune! Good for him.

Tammy: May I continue? The question in its entirety is: What profit is it to a man if he gains the whole world and loses his own soul?

ALPHA: He wins the game of life—the one with the most toys wins!

BETA: He makes the cover of TIME Magazine as Most Influential Personality of the Year.

GAMMA: The profit become a loss, when treasures on earth ultimately perish...

Dorcas: (*dings*) It has to be “BETA,” Tammy. Definitely BETA - that’s my final answer!

Tammy: Awwww--you missed it again, Dorcas. Definitely not “BETA.” Naomi, do you have a guess?

Naomi: I repeat, I don’t “guess,” Tammy. My answer is GAMMA. You’ve never seen a u-haul behind a hearse, have you? Earthly treasures are temporary; our soul is eternal, and you can’t take your fame and fortune or even a magazine cover with you.

Tammy: Naomi, correct again, for a total of 400 denarii, and you and a guest will be traveling by first class chariot to the balmy and romantic Sea of Galilee. And watch out for some of those tempests on the water (*snarky laugh*) So, as we end tonight’s episode, Naomi is in the lead. But don’t you worry, Dorcas, there are three weeks left in the game. Come back next week to watch these two contestants battle it out on **Jerusalem Jeopardy**.



JERUSALEM JEOPARDY SKIT TWO SCRIPT

**Questions: Do you believe I am able?
Do you think they were worse sinners?**

Announcer: *(off-camera)* Welcome ladies and gentlemen to our second episode of Jerusalem Jeopardy, the game show where the questions are essential for eternity, crucial for the cross, significant to the soul but the points don't matter. I'm your announcer, Johnny Olsen. This week's episode is "Faith or Fiction" You've been reading about Jesus in the Galilee Gazette, hearing reports on TV Mount Zion, otherwise known as TMZ and even the tabloid tablets that you read in the marketplace have outlandish stories by alleged "witnesses." Are the reports true? Are the reporters jokers or journalists? Are we hearing fake news? We'll find out, as we delve deep into the dark bowels of the truth. Inquiring minds want to know.

And here's the host of Jerusalem Jeopardy, the one, the only, the hostess with the most-est, your sweetheart and mine, Tammy Tabernacle

(Audience goes wild)

Tammy: Oh, you're too kind. Thank you, thank you! Thanks to those who are joining us here live in the studio, and to those joining over at our favorite local station, K-ROCK Channel XII. Now, let's welcome back our two returning contestants: Dorcas Dimwit and Naomi Know-It-All. How have you been this week? Dorcas?

Dorcas: Well, I'm glad to be here. I almost didn't make it.

Tammy: Oh dear...What happened?

Dorcas: You know my husband is a sheep farmer. This is lamb harvesting season, you know, and those lambs can be so hard to keep track of. Similar to coyotes, they are very wily. Dorcas: I see what you did there. You--y-o-u and ewe --e-w-e. Nice. Sheep farmer humor. Well, that was just Wednesday! Wait until you hear what happened on Friday...

Tammy: I sorry, Dorcas, our time is limited and we need to move on. How about you, Naomi?

Naomi: My week is lacking in that type of comic error. In fact, with the head scribes out of the office preparing for the next big feast, the Temple Auxiliary was a little quiet. As you know, Cana is well-known all over Israel for its lavish wedding wines, its bold bar mitzvah spritzers and its delectable cheese, grape and olive boards. Tammy, the winner of this week's grand prize will be posting about this for weeks, getting "likes" and "thumbs up" from all their friends and family.

Tammy: Thanks Johnny. Sounds like a party for your tastebuds. Let's get started with our first question. Hand on your buzzers, ladies. A man named Jesus has been very prominent in the news lately. Rumors have been flying about His many miracles. Eyewitness reports say that He's been seen healing the lame and even healing blind eyes, to name just a few examples. Can this be true? Does this man have the ability to perform real miracles? And our answers:

ALPHA: Jesus is just another magician, walking the country, deceiving people with his sleight of hand and parlor tricks.

BETA: Yes, He is obviously able to do these miracles because He is the Son of God.

GAMMA: These reports were exaggerated. The healings occurred due to their fantastic in-network medical attention and experimental drugs. Miracles are free--these people were subject to co-pay.

Dorcias: (*dings first*) ALPHA! It’s easier to find tickets to Hamilton than it is to find tickets to Jesus.

Tammy: I’m sorry, Dorcas. ALPHA is not the correct answer. Naomi, do you have a guess?

Naomi: You know how I feel about that word “guess.” I refuse to guess when the answer is obvious. The correct answer is BETA. Jesus is the Son of God, and as such, He is all-powerful, and is more than able to do more than what we ask or think. You can believe it.

Tammy: That is correct. Points are doubled, so you lead today’s round with 400 denarii. Let’s go on to our next question. It’s a little involved, so listen carefully. We were all horrified to hear of the deadly accident at the Tower of Siloam when it fell and took the lives of 18 of our countrymen. Here’s the question: Did they lose their lives because they were worse sinners than those who survived that day?

ALPHA: Que sera, sera. Whatever will be, will be.

BETA: It proves that the contractors clearly did not build that tower to meet city code. Short cuts kill! Budget cuts kill.

GAMMA: No

DELTA: Yes, at least three of those men were known felons, and deserved what they got.

Dorcias: (*dings first*) I’m going with DELTA. I heard that Theo the Thieving Thug was among those in the rubble, so it makes sense to me that all those killed must have deserved this punishment.

Tammy: I’m sorry, Dorcas. DELTA is not the correct answer. Naomi, do you have the answer?

Naomi: As a matter of fact, I do. The correct answer is GAMMA--no. They were not worse sinners. We’re all sinners, but we all have the opportunity to repent to avoid eternal punishment, which is much worse than death by falling bricks and mortar.

Tammy: Naomi, correct again, for a total of 800 denarii for these two games. You and a guest will be traveling by first class chariot to the beautiful land of Cana. Make sure you bring us back a bottle of that world-famous show-stopping, wedding wine.

Naomi: Oh, I will! I’ll be sure to leave room in my carry-on for an extra wineskin!

Tammy: So, as we end tonight’s episode, Naomi is firmly in the lead. But don’t you worry, Dorcas, we’re only halfway through. You have no where to go but up. Come back next week to watch these two contestants battle it out on **Jerusalem Jeopardy**.

Announcer: *(off-camera)* Welcome ladies and gentlemen to our third episode of **Jerusalem Jeopardy**, the game show where the questions are essential for eternity, crucial for the cross, significant to the soul but the points don't matter. I'm your announcer, Johnny Olsen. This week's episode is "Faith and Obedience versus Tradition" You've been reading about Jesus in the Galilee Gazette, hearing reports on TV Mount Zion, otherwise known as TMZ, and even the tabloid tablets that you read in the marketplace have outlandish stories by alleged "witnesses." Are the reports true? Are the reporters jokers or journalists? Are we hearing fake news? We'll find out, as we delve deeper into the dark bowels of the truth. Inquiring minds want to know.

And here's the host of **Jerusalem Jeopardy**, the one, the only, the hostess with the most-est, your sweetheart and mine, Tammy Tabernacle

(Audience goes wild)

(contestants “ooh!” “aah”)

Tammy: Thanks Johnny. Sounds like an adventure for sure. Let’s get started with our first question. Hand on your buzzers, ladies. A common response to the storms and trials of life is to be fearful. Why do we get fearful at these times?

ALPHA: Forgetfulness - we forget what God has promised

BETA: Unbelief - we know what God has said, but we don’t believe.

GAMMA: Lack of faith - we find it hard to trust in what we don’t see

DELTA: All of the above.

Dorcias: *(dings)* I know this one for sure, because I know storms. Caesarea has storms, and storms make sheep skittish. We have thunder storms, lightening storms, sand storms, hail storms...

Tammy: Dorcas, did you have an answer?

Dorcias: Yes...I think the answer has to be GAMMA, because you can’t see in a storm. All that rain and hail--it blinds you. You can’t see your hand in front of your face.

Tammy: I’m sorry, Dorcas. That is NOT the correct answer. Naomi, what do you think?

Naomi: Well Tammy...As much as I hate to agree with my opponent, it’s true that storms and trials are difficult to navigate, and fear is often the go-to emotion. However, the correct answer is DELTA--ALL OF THE ABOVE. We forget, we don’t believe, and we panic from lack of faith. All of those are true.

Tammy: Right again, Naomi for 800 denarii. This correct answer has taken you to a total of 2000 denarii.

Naomi: YES!

Tammy: Dorcas, don’t give up. You’re fast on that buzzer. All you need is ONE correct answer tonight, just ONE. And here’s our final question for today’s episode of Jerusalem

Jeopardy: We’re big on following the rules of the law around here, down to the tiniest detail. How can following the tradition of our forefathers become too important?

ALPHA: Sometimes we follow tradition, but disobey God as we do it.

BETA: What makes grandpa an expert on how we should do things in the modern world?

GAMMA: (*sings from “Fiddler on the Roof”*) Tradition! Tradition! Traditions can never be too important.

Dorcas: (*dings*) Azariah’s grandparents, great-grandparents and great-great grandparents were all sheep farmers--it’s TRADITION! My answer is GAMMA--because on my sheep farm, we have a lot of traditions and those traditions ARE the law, and you can’t deviate! Then it wouldn’t be a TRADITION. We are traditionally traditional. Trust the traditions--you can’t go wrong. It takes a lot of the guesswork out of sheep farming. It’s a good tradition when people follow it for years and years and years--right?

Tammy: Wrong, Dorcas. GAMMA is the wrong answer.

Naomi: (*dings*)

Tammy: Your buzzer works. Do you have an answer, Naomi?

Naomi: Of course I do. The answer, without question, is ALPHA. Traditions are okay to a point, but when they are contrary to obedience to God, that is when they become too important.

Tammy: Well said, Naomi. And you won all the points again tonight, so pack your bags because you are headed to Mt. Sinai. Pack your hiking boots and your sunscreen, and be sure to buy one of those pillar of fire paperweight. (ha, ha)

Naomi: I’m looking forward to it, Tammy. Souvenirs for everyone--even you, Dorcas!

Tammy: So, as we end tonight’s episode, Naomi is still firmly holds the lead with 2800 denarii. But don’t you worry, Dorcas, you have one more chance to redeem yourself. Scores are tripled in the final round, so there’s still a remote chance that you will score. Anything can happen on **Jerusalem Jeopardy**. Are the reports true? Are the reporters jokers or journalists? Are we hearing fake news? We'll find out, as we delve into deeper into the dark bowels of the truth. Inquiring minds want to know.

And here's the host of **Jerusalem Jeopardy**, the one, the only, the hostess with the most-est, your sweetheart and ours, Tammy Tabernacle!

(*Audience goes wild*)

Dorcas: (*dings*) My answer is YES, Yes Tammy I do smell victory. I'm feeling lucky tonight!

Tammy: Well, not exactly what I meant...

Naomi: (*sarcastic*) Good luck with that! I’m feeling prepared and ready to win it all, Tammy! So if it’s the aroma of victory you smell and not fried chicken, I would venture to say that it is my victory you’re smelling.

Tammy: So let’s play **Jerusalem Jeopardy!!** And what are we playing for today, John-John?

Announcer: Tammy, today’s prize package includes an all-expense paid river cruise on the Jordan River. The stops you’ll make along the way will make this cruise one to remember. First, you’ll visit the Valley of Elah, where David met and killed Goliath. Dine at the world-renowned Giant Head Restaurant, and try your hand at using a slingshot with five smooth stones. The next stop is En Gedi, where you will enjoy two nights in the Caves of David before you continue to Mount Nebo, where you will have a scenic view of the Dead Sea and Jericho from your rustic mountain cabin. Upon reboarding the riverboat, your final destination will be the banks of Bethel, where you can cast lots in the river casinos. Talk about needing luck!

(contestants “ooh!” “aah”)

Tammy: Thanks J-Man. Sounds like an adventure for sure. Let’s get started with our first question. Hand on your buzzers, ladies. Our law says to love God with all of your heart, all your mind and all your strength. How do we keep ourselves from being distracted from that priority?

ALPHA: It is impossible...the shiny things of the world grab your attention, and make you feel so good.

BETA: Why would we want to? Life is full of so many good things to do, and see, and eat, and buy. There’s only 24 hours in a day. Every one of those hours can be spent pursuing thing we like such as BOGO sales, vacations, fine dining. We should take advantage of these opportunities as they come our way!

GAMMA: Squirrel! Oh, sorry! Just a momentary distraction.

DELTA: By keeping our eyes upon God every day, we can avoid those distractions and compromises.

Dorcias: (*dings*) I think the answer must be BETA. This big beautiful world is ours to enjoy, and we should love the things in the world with all of our strength. Didn’t God create fancy perfumes, fine apparel and gold for our pleasure? And then He went a step further by providing Kohl’s cash! It would be a sin to ignore all that!

Tammy: You know, you’re right, Dorcias! You make a good point.

Announcer: Tammy., that is not the correct answer. Read your Q&A card again.

Tammy: Oh! Dorcas. I’m sorry, that is not the correct answer to this question. Do you have this game confused with “The Biggest Loser?” You are wrong again!

(Tammy stares at Naomi) Well??

Naomi: Should I ding? *(dings)* DELTA! It’s DELTA! God needs to be our priority, and when He is our first love, everything else is in its rightful place.

Tammy: Right again. Your score is really getting up there. Now it’s time to make a wager for the “final Jeopardy” question.

Dorcas: What can I possibly wager??--I have zero denarii?!

Tammy: You’re right Dorcas. You’ve got nothing, but you haven’t lost yet.

Dorcas: Okay then, I’m all in. I’ll wager my whole entire zero!

Naomi: Well, I’m all in too. 3200 denarii on the final Jeopardy question.

Tammy: Ok, our wagers have been made. There is no turning back now, ladies. And here is your final Jeopardy question: We tend to compare ourselves with others--their position, possession, God’s blessing in their lives... For instance, hypothetically--take a game show host. Some are adored by the public, funny, successful, beautiful. Is it worth your time to compare yourself to such people? You’ve got 15 seconds to write your answer.

(music)

Tammy: Time’s up, Ladies. Let’s go first to our runner-up, Dorcas. What do you say?

Dorcas: How does comparison help anyone? All it does is make us discontent with our lot in life. My answer is *(holds up card)* NO - we shouldn’t compare.

Tammy: And now to our current leader, Naomi

Naomi: Well, I think we need to carefully examine what others have so we can determine who God loves the most. My answer is *(holds up card)* YES - we should compare!

Tammy: Well, both of those answers make sense to me. Yes, it could discourage you, or it could motivate you....

Announcer: Uh, Tammy! There is only one right answer.

Tammy: Oh, yes of course. *(refers to Q&A card) (surprised)* Wait just an olive-picking minute! I can’t believe this. The correct answer was “NO - comparison is not a worthwhile activity! Dorcas was correct in final Jeopardy! Folks, if you aren’t already sitting down, find
