Girl: (pondering) Yes, that is an ingredient you use when you make pasole, right

Mom: No, you're thinking of "hominy." The word is "homonym." It is when two words sound the same, but have totally different meanings and maybe even different spellings.

Girl: Well, spelling is my best subject Mommy.

Mom: Ok good. So there is the word "presence" spelled p-r-e-s-e-n-c-e. For example, you left your bedroom and came into my presence tonight. We're together. Understand?

Girl: I think so. You're saying there is a present in here for me--a Christmas Eve present! (*starts looking under mom's chair*)

Mom: No, you are talking about the other word "presents" spelled p-r-e-s-e-n-t-s, which are gifts given from one to another.

Girl: Ok, and....I love talking about gifts. In fact, we read a verse last week that perfectly describes my feelings about that. Mom, I am zealous for gifts!

Mom: Do you even know what zealous means?

Girl: Not exactly, but I am that if it means I love and desire the best gifts. That's in the Bible too. Mom, you should pay more attention in church. Even you should be zealous for gifts like I am, and desiring the best ones.

Mom: I do pay attention in church, but I think we need get our Bible and our dictionary out.

Girl: Oh no...Please don't tell me you bought me a dictionary for Christmas. Can't we just Google it?

Mom: (gets Bible out) Let's start here. You know this verse--what does John 3:16 say?

Girl: I know that one really well. "God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten son...

Mom: Stop here. So God gave Jesus to the world as a "present"

Girl: He didn't wrap Him up, did He?

Mom: Well, sort of. The Bible tells us he was wrapped in swaddling clothes after He was born. And remember how the wise men came and brought Him gifts or "presents" of

Girl: I know, I know! Gold, frankfurters, and mirrors.

Mom: Close.-They brought gold, frankincense and myrrh. And yes, those were "presents" p-r-e-s-e-n-t-s. But what is most important about this story is that the shepherds and the wisemen were in the "presence" p-r-e-s-e-n-c-e of Jesus. That's what I am trying to explain to you. It is a significant difference. Do you understand?

Mom: What!! Stay out of my closet. You're right, it is not talking about any of those gifts under the tree or what may or may not be in my closet. But the meaning of Christmas is that God has sent His Son as a gift to us so that we could believe in Him and have everlasting life, and our joy comes from being in the "presence" of the Lord--being near Him.

Girl: ohhh...So it's like when Grandma comes to our house tomorrow, she will bring me a present (and maybe it will be a puppy!!), but because she comes here, I can can enjoy her presences and her presents. I like getting her present, but I really like playing games and baking, and reading stories and taking walks with Grandma when she comes.

Mom: I think you are understanding better now. So those Bible verses you were telling me about are talking about being close to Jesus all the time and not about the gifts under our tree. (girl makes a big yawn) We can be glad in His presence, we can have fullness of joy in His presence, thanksgiving, singing, refreshing--all in His presence. (girl is getting drowsy and leans onto Mom's lap)

Mom: Sweet dreams, Sweetie. Tomorrow we will enjoy our presents under the tree and, most of all, His presence.
